Under 18 Visa Requirements

Travelling with children (under 18)



South Africa has relaxed its requirements for travelling with children under the age of 18. Visa exempt children (including UK Nationals visiting for tourism purposes) entering South Africa accompanied by an adult are required to present only a valid passport on arrival, regardless of whether the child is travelling with both parents, one parent, or an adult who is not a biological parent (for more information, please see the [Immigration Act](#) in conjunction with this [advisory](#) from the South African Department of Home Affairs). This includes children travelling as part of school groups.

- Sandals / comfy shoes to wear after work hours
