Location

With the greatest concentration of biodiversity in the world, Costa Rica is a must for any conservationist. Over 25% of the country is protected in national parks, this is due to the country's progressive policies on environmental protection and sustainable ecotourism.

Costa Rica's temperate (warm) climate and fertile soils are suitable to agricultural production. There is an abundance of water-yearly rainfall averages 4 meters and irrigation has been successfully applied to develop the more arid regions

The government supports growers through research, training, and technical assistance even though the agricultural sector in Costa Rica has been declining in importance since the 1950s. However, in 1998 still accounted for 15 percent of GDP and employed one-fifth of the labor force. Almost 10 percent of the country's land is used for agriculture.

You will be based in Esparza, Monterverde and San Mateo, these regions produce everything tropical and are known as the "cradle of Avocado".

You will be based at the family run "school house" in Esparza, North Puntarenas, a small agricultural town near the Pacific Ocean. Esparza is located 80kms from the capital city of San Jose in the countryside offering rolling hills, breath taking mountain views and deep river valleys.

From your base you will experience some of the beautiful scenery and agriculture that Cost Rica has to offer.

When at Esparza breakfasts and some dinners will be provided at the volunteer accommodation; meals are mainly taken in the volunteer accommodation on site during activities (the cook is excellent); for those meals that are not included at Esparza there are a variety of restaurants in the vicinity that offer different choices.
