Passport Requirements

It can take up to 6 weeks to obtain a passport – remember to start this process in plenty of time.

Your passport needs to be valid for at least 6 months beyond your intended stay and have at least two blank pages.

After a visit to the local creche and a community river litter clean up, visit the Gogos (grannies)

On this community visit, students will also be able to experience village life and buy a coke or snacks from a local "spaza" shop (bring along cash for this) but money for the purchase of hats needs to be arranged at camp the night after the visit.
