A full day will be planned but will vary from day to day depending on the day's task and research goals.



Sample Itinerary

- Day 1: Upon arrival in Johannesburg, you will be met by a road transfer company that will take you to your destination in the bush. Once you arrive, you'll have time to check into your cottage and unpack. Afterwards, you'll enjoy an introductory lunch where you will meet your guides and hosts, followed by an orientation of the cottages and horses. In the evening, you can relax with sundowners under a large fig tree before enjoying a catered Braai dinner at the cottages.
- Day 2: In the morning, the group will split into two. One group will take a rural village tour to Boschdraai, a village on the property, where they will have the opportunity to visit modest homes, meet local people, and see animals and donkeys. The second group will take a guided walk through the bush, learning to track animals through spoor and dung. After lunch, the groups will switch activities in the afternoon, with one group going on a game drive and the other group taking their first horse safari. In the evening, everyone will gather for a memorable astronomy show with Dr. Phil Calcott, where you'll gaze at the stars while relaxing in the bush with blankets, pillows, and hot water bottles.
- Day 3: The morning will again see the group divided into two. One group will go on a guided bush walk, while the other will take the rural village tour to Boschdraai. In the afternoon, the groups will switch again, with one group enjoying another horse safari and the other heading out for a game drive. The day will end with sundowners at the Bush Deck, followed by a catered dinner.
- Day 4: On this day, one group will engage in community work, either helping to paint the community center or building kennels for the local animal shelter, while the other group will go on a longer horse safari to search for larger herds of game. After a picnic lunch in the gardens, all students will participate in bush clearing, where they will remove any wire or dangerous objects from the bush. In the evening, a catered dinner will be served.
- Day 5: You will begin the day with a packed breakfast before heading out for a full-day excursion to Entabeni Game Reserve, where you'll go on a series of Big 5 game drives. A packed lunch will be provided by the pool, and the day will conclude with a catered dinner back at the cottages.

Sample Itinerary

- Day 6: The morning will start with herding, feeding, and tacking up the horses. Afterward, the group will split again, with one group going on a longer horse safari while the other participates in community work. In the afternoon, everyone will meet for donkey welfare work in the town of Vaalwater, where they will assess the condition of donkeys, treat wounds, and fit new harnesses and bridles. The day will finish with dinner at a restaurant in Vaalwater.
- Day 7: On Sunday, you will begin by herding and manually dipping horses to prevent ticks. Later, Vet Nurse Kirsty will give a lecture covering equine diseases in South Africa, tick prevention and treatment, and basic horse first aid. After lunch, the group will split again, with some continuing community work and others doing bush clearing. The day will conclude with a catered Braai dinner.
- Day 8: This will be your day off, with options such as the Lekhalo zipline, massages, an extra horse safari, relaxing by the pool, or a tour of Leorna. A catered lunch and dinner will be provided.
- Day 9: In the morning, one group will engage in bush clearing work, while the other goes on a third horse safari. After lunch at the Bush Deck, all students will participate in an Aardvark safari. This will begin with a presentation on Aardvarks, followed by a game drive to track and observe these unique animals.
- Day 10: The morning will begin with a walking trail through the bush, followed by a hands-on session learning basic farriery, including trimming horse hooves. In the afternoon, the group will split, with one group taking a final horse safari and the other continuing community work. The evening will feature sundowners at the pool and a catered dinner.
- Day 11: On your final day, your transfer will take you to Horizon Horseback, where you will see a large herd of over 110 horses and watch a demonstration based on Monty Roberts' horse training methods. On the way back, you'll visit Prime Crew Animal Shelter to deliver the dog kennels you helped build. Afterward, you will be taken to OR Tambo Airport in Johannesburg for your evening flight home.



Accommodation

The group will be accommodated in the beautiful historic thatch cottages surrounded by gardens, horses, animals and views of the bushveld.
