

What is a Game Reserve?

- A game reserve is a large area of protected land where wild animals can live safely.
- Wildlife is free roaming throughout the reserve allowing them to thrive in their natural habitat.
- Reserves are either Government Owned (National Parks) or Privately Owned/Managed.
- Most reserves will have physical boundaries i.e. electrified fence line.
- Due to physical boundaries, wildlife must be managed due to restraints on population growth, migration and resources.
- Wildlife is protected but also utilised as a tourist attraction (Eco Tourism) which creates funding for conservation efforts and research.

Intaka Bird Lodge







Accommodation

The student centre and camp is based on the reserve and boasts ten tents that sleep two to four people per tent in single beds, each tent also has lighting and electricity supply. There are communal hot and cold showers and regular flushing toilets. There are communal facilities including a lecture room, canteen, lounge, entertainment area and storage fridge.







ACCOMMODATION & LIFESTYLE

Meals

All meals are provided in the communal dining room, there is an outside area for dining as well.

Three meals are provided daily on a self cook basis, prepared communally by the group. Students will take part in communal cooking and keeping the kitchen tidy.

Meals will either be served at the facility or in the field 'picnic' style, this depends on activities either planned or unscheduled.

The research team often work 6 days a week so time off is often limited to Sundays only.

Most evenings are spent at leisure around the camp.

Turing Scheme

The Turing Scheme is a UK government scheme

SRUC has been successful in securing some funding for overseas projects

The scheme provides some funding to students to be able to travel overseas

- You must be over 18 at time of departure
- The project must be at least 28 days in length
- Funding is spilt in to living costs and travel costs
- Extra funding is available for those students coming from a disadvantaged background

Turing Scheme Funding

- All students are entitled to living costs of £17.00 per day
- 17.00 x 28 days £476
- Students from a disadvantaged background are entitled to travel costs of £905.00
- Living cost of £21.00 per day
- £21.00 x 28 = £588.00
- £588 + £905 = £1493.00

Extra funding for students from disadvantaged backgrounds Generally define these students as people who meet any of the following criteria:

- someone with an annual household income of £25,000 or less
- someone who receives Universal Credit or income-related benefits because they are financially supporting: themselves / themselves and someone who is dependent on them, such as a child or partner
- someone with experience of being in care or who is a care leaver including anyone who is or has been in care, or from a looked after background, at any stage of their life
- a carer, meaning anyone who both:
- looks after a family member, partner or friend who needs help because of their illness, frailty, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction, and cannot cope without their support
- is not paid for this care
- someone who is estranged including anyone who has had no contact with their biological or adoptive parents for 12 months or more, or the relationship with their parents has broken down within the last 12 months
- a refugee or an asylum seeker
