Itinerary

- 23/06- Arrive at San Jose (SJO) airport. Your group guide will meet you and transfer you to the Hotel Las Palmas in Esparza.
- 24/06 Travel by coach to Goshen de Bataan, approximately 4 hours duration, then transfer to the boat for 45 minutes to the project, dinner at the project. Breakfast & Dinner included
- 24/06 28/06 Turtle Conservation Project. Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided each day.
- 28/06 After breakfast depart Pacuare by boat then drive through Braulio Carrillo National Park. Dinner and overnight at the Hotel Las Palmas in Esparza. Breakfast & Dinner included.
- 29/06 After breakfast visit the Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve. Dinner and overnight Cascade Verde Uvita or Hostel Manuel Antonio, Breakfast & Dinner included.

Whilst you will cover all the activities on the itinerary certain days may swap around during your time at Esparza

- 01/07- After breakfast visit Playa Uvita Marino Ballena National Overnight at Cascade Verde Uvita or Hostel Manuel Antonio. Breakfast & Dinner included.
- 02/07- Breakfast then at the Toucan Rescue Overnight at Esparza. Breakfast & Dinner included
- 03/07- Breakfast then a visit to the Maritime Park Puntarenas Overnight at Esparza. Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner included
- 04/07- After breakfast visit Las Hornillas, Miravalles Volcano. Overnight at Esparza. Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner.
- 05/07 Breakfast before a crocodile boat tour on the River Tarcoles Overnight at Esparza, Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner included
- 06/07 After breakfast transfer to the airport for your flight home to the UK.

Pacuare Turtle Project & Esparza

Accommodation at the turtle project is in shared beach huts, these are basic, clean and comfortable. There are small lockers available for personal valuables such as passports - you will need to bring a padlock. Electricity is generated via solar and has to be rationed, so can be sporadic.

The Hotel Las Palmas in Esparza has shared rooms, a large garden with swimming pool and sports activities. WiFi coverage and hydroelectricity are both excellent.

Food

Whilst at Pacuare Turtle Project you will have three meals a day provided. Generally, this will be local food – rice and beans!

Please be aware there is no shop at the Turtle Centre so ensure you have bought any snacks/drinks before arriving.

When at Esparza breakfasts and dinners will be provided at the hotel; for those meals that are not included at Esparza there are a variety of restaurants in the vicinity that offer different choices.

Budget approximately \$10-\$15 per meal including a drink for meals out.

It is important that you advise us of any dietary requirements be they preference, allergies or intolerances so we can advise the project to enable us to ensure that you are adequately catered for.



Suggested kit list

A large backpack is recommended as your main luggage, not a suitcase; you will be travelling by basic means of transport in Costa Rica so a suitcase would not be practical

- Short sleeve and long sleeve shirts
- Long work trousers and shorts (Or work trousers with zip-off longs)
- T shirts
- Dark clothing for night work (turtle project)
- Hiking Boots/comfortable walking shoes
- Rain jacket (dark colour)
- Fleece/jumper (for cool evenings)
- Warmer clothing for winter
- Daypack rucksack
- Socks (suitable for trousers to tuck into)
- Hat
- Sandals/flip flops
- Changes of casual clothes for evenings
- Underwear

Spending money: \$200 - \$250

- Beach towel
- Swimwear
- Toiletries
- Mosquito / insect repellent (must be natural/citronella for the turtle centre)
- Personal medication (including Imodium, good) for travelling)
- Water bottle (at least 1 litre)
- Dissolvable sterilising tablets
- Sunglasses
- Sunscreen
- Mosquito net

Currency & Credit Cards

The colòn is the currency of Costa Rica although US\$ are widely accepted at hotels, restaurants and most supermarkets as are all major credit cards.

For small services, including local meals or public transport, be prepared to pay in local currency, you can withdraw local currency at ATM's

Travel Cards are very useful; preload before travelling and the best exchange rate is used. Wise Travel Card offers up to £500.00 with no transfer fee for GAP Africa Projects travellers

Phones & Internet

Mobile phone coverage is good at the accommodation, although there may be some areas on the reserve where there isn't any coverage. eSIM or purchasing a SIM card at the airport is another option

Some Wi-Fi if provided free of charge at the accommodation. Internet speeds are not up to international urban standards but are effective for communication.

Health Risks

Immunisation:

When entering Costa Rica, no international immunisation is required.,

Our advice: Visit your local (travel) doctor to get up-to-date information about requirements when travelling.

DTP inoculation (diphtheria, tetanus and polio) is essential. Please visit the following web page for advice from the UK Foreign Office:

Drinking Water:

Drinking water is available at the project (filtered rainwater); always make sure you keep hydrated.

Malaria & Dengue:

There is a low risk of malaria in Costa Rica, Since 2013 there has been a sharp rise in cases of Dengue and cases of Chikungunya virus have been confirmed; you should take steps to avoid being bitten by mosquitos by using repellent and wearing long sleeves etc.

Medical care in Costa Rica is of a high standard. Only emergency medical treatment is available without charge for visitors so please ensure you have adequate travel health insurance to cover medical treatment abroad and repatriation.

Insurance

Personal travel insurance is compulsory. Travel insurance does not need to be expensive and there are many good deals available for backpackers etc. Always be sure to check the insurance details to make sure you are covered for Covid 19, theft, loss, illness and injury. Check to see if your medical benefits are paid out as they incur or on your return home.

Passport Requirements

It can take up to 6 weeks to obtain a passport remember to start this process in plenty of time.

Your passport needs to be valid for at least 30 days beyond your intended stay and have at least two blank pages.

Visa Requirements

A visa is not required for British passport holders; all other nationalities must check visa requirements with the Embassy and Consulate of the Republic of Costa Rica.


Useful Apps for Next of Kin
